From Pastor Craig...

“Taking Notice”

Each morning when I arrive and each evening when I leave I stop by it. I pull my car up along side of it and roll down my window so that I can listen to its soothing rhythms. The cathartic sounds seem to say, “Be still, and know that I am God.” It only takes seconds but it prepares me for the start of my day before the frantic activity of the office and it calms me down before I arrive home. I stop to take notice of the beautiful waterfall on the south east side of Good Shepherd’s building each day.

After my first 11 weeks at Good Shepherd, I have had the privilege to take notice of many wonderful programs, people and blessings. I have made it a priority to stop and read bulletin boards, look at pictures, talk to people, and to wander the building and grounds. I am taking notice of the many blessings of Good Shepherd. Today, as I write, I just arrived home after taking notice of our Good Shepherd Preschool Spring Program! Have you ever been to one of those? It was as exciting as Easter Sunday to watch three consecutive groups of parents and extended family fill the sanctuary as they celebrated their children’s achievement in their first stab at being young entertainers. I took notice of what the parents said to me as they endorsed and praised the program. It was not

just a program, but an event as the crowd moved from the sanctuary to the Book Fair in Rausch Hall and the Art Show in the activities center.

I have taken notice of the number of adults involved with our scouting program as they served up a great meal and as I spoke to a Cub Scout Pack about God and country. It was a blast to take the pack to my office for gumballs!

I have taken notice of how much it means to those in the hospital and rehab centers to be visited and called. I have noticed what it means to be noticed.

You can probably guess where I am going with this...have you taken notice of what God is doing in the life of your faith community? Taking notice only involves a few seconds and minutes of intentional observation. Now is the perfect time to begin taking notice of what God is doing in our church. God is working, and blessing, and multiplying and growing God’s kingdom. Let’s take notice so we can become excited for what is next! This week, stop by the waterfall. I will be happy to come out and wade in the cool water with you.

TAIZE/LABYRINTH WORSHIP SERVICE SUNDAY, MAY 22 - 5:00 P.M.

The turmoil of our thoughts can be compared to the storm that struck the disciples’ boat on the Sea of Galilee while Jesus was sleeping. Like them, we may be helpless, full of anxiety, and incapable of calming ourselves. But Christ is able to come to our help as well. As he rebuked the wind and the sea and "there was a great calm", he can also quiet our heart when it is agitated by fears and worries (Mark 4). Remaining silent, we trust and hope in God. One psalm suggests that silence is even a form of praise. We are used to reading at the beginning of Psalm 65: "Praise is due to you, O God". This translation follows the Greek text, but actually the Hebrew text printed in most Bibles reads: "Silence is praise to you, O God". When words and thoughts come to an end, God is praised in silent wonder and admiration.~Taken from “The Value of Silence” by Brother Alois, Prior of Taizé

We invite you to experience the silence, song, scripture and prayer of Taize and the prayer walk of the Labyrinth. Please enter quietly through door #5.

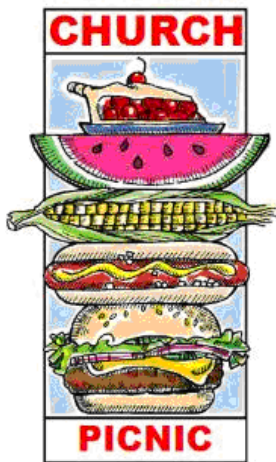
ROMAN 12:13 - AN OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE

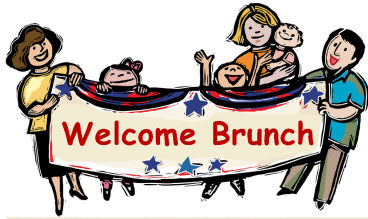

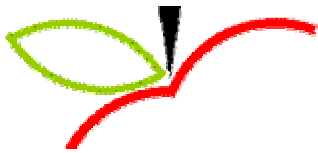
UMW READING PROGRAM 2011

ReGenesis Worship Service Concludes

It was exactly one year ago that the first ReGenesis worship service began in Raasch Hall. It was led by a group of college, high and middle school young adult leaders whose desire was to create a dynamic young adult worship service. During the following months, these leaders explored what that picture would look like by having guest speakers, current music videos, weekly communion etc. By the fall, most of the leaders graduated or moved on to college. Those few remaining leaders plus a few new leaders continued to explore ways of meaningful worship. During the following eight months, it became clear that an all volunteer leadership team did not have the time or the ability to support a dynamic high energy young adult

worship service. As a result, the service evolved to a fellowship based worship service centered around group prayer, message, song and communion. As wonderful as this is, the leaders discussed and agreed that their initial desire of wanting to establish a new young adult worship service that is more high energy is unchanged. Therefore, they have decided to dissolve ReGenesis freeing them up to refocus their energies on supporting any new young adult worship initiatives the church may desire to begin. Thanks to all who have been supportive in this endeavor for it has given young adults powerful opportunities in exploring and developing their spiritual leadership abilities.
